

## The Creation of Adam

### Review

### The Creation of Adam—Day Six

- a) Adam (red, ruddy).
  - i. An actual individual (Gen. 1:26, 27; 2:5, 7<sup>(2)</sup>, 8, 16, 18, 22, 23 *cf.* 5:2).
  - ii. From God (Lu. 3:38).
- b) Adam was created in the image of God (Gen. 1:27).
  - i. God’s image is light (Ps. 104:1-2; 2 Cor. 4:4-6; Lu. 2:9).
  - ii. Adam’s image is an affront to Lucifer (Ez. 28:14, 16-17).
  - iii. Adam’s image different from animals (1 Cor. 15:39).
  - iv. Adam loses his image when he fell (Gen. 5:3; 1 Cor. 15:40, 49 *cf.* Jn. 17:22, 24).
- c) Adam was created in the likeness of God (Gen. 1:27).
  - i. God created his human spirit; the ability to reason, think abstractly (1 Thes. 5:23; 1 Cor. 2:11).
  - ii. The human spirit made Adam different from animals, *i.e.* different likeness (Gen. 2:18-20; Jam. 3:7-9).
- d) Adam created with lives (Gen. 2:7; Lev. 17:11, 14 *cf.* Acts 27:37).
  - i. Adam’s body was made then formed—not created (Gen. 1:27, 2:7).
  - ii. Adam had enough immaterial parts for God to build Eve (Gen. 2:21-22).
