Review

- i. On the Sixth Day God created Adam as an individual (Gen. 1:26-27).
- ii. Adam's body was formed from existing material (Gen. 2:7).
- iii. Adam's immaterial parts were created out of nothing (Gen. 1:27).
- iv. Adam was created with lives (Gen. 2:7).
 - In the image of God—garment of light (Ps. 104:1-2).
 - In the likeness of God—reasoning ability (Jam. 3:7-9).
- v. Adam was unlike any of the animals (Gen. 2:19-20; 1:22).
- vi. God used Adam's immaterial parts to build Eve (Gen. 2:21-23).

The Composition of Mankind (1 Thes. 5:23)

A. Body

- a) A tent housing the person (2 Cor. 5:1, 4; 2 Pet. 1:13).
- b) Subject to death due to Adam's sin (Rom. 5:12-14; Gen. 2:17; 3:22; Heb. 9:27 *cf.* 1 Tim. 6:16).
- c) Death of the body is separation from the soul and spirit.
 - i. Spirit leaving body (Jam. 2:26; Acts 7:59; Lu. 23:46).
 - ii. Soul leaving body (Acts 5:5, 10; 12:23).
 - iii. The person different from the body (Lu. 23:43, 46; 16:22).

B. The Soul and Spirit are distinctly different components (Heb. 4:12).

C. Spirit

- a) The seat of rationale (1 Cor. 2:11).
- b) The realm in which we are saved (1 Cor. 6:17).

D. Soul

- a) The soul is presently unsaved (1 Pet. 1:9).
- b) The animating element (Lev. 17; 1 Cor. 15:45; Mt. 10:28).
- c) The survival instinct (Acts 2:27; 27:10, 22, 37).
- d) The seat of emotions (Mt. 26:38).
- e) Interprets bodily senses (Mt. 6:25; 2 Pet. 2: 8, 14; Rev. 18:13-14).
