The Promise to Christians that the Sin Nature can be Defeated

Review: The battle for our mind.

- The Christian has three spiritual enemies that put lusts in our minds.
- The primary spiritual enemy is within: the sin nature, *aka* the flesh, sin principle, a propensity to sin, acting as though God does not set restraints.
- Each Christian has a sin nature (1 Jn. 1:8).
- The exactness of the verbal, plenary God-breathed written Word (2 Tim. 3:16).

The Truth: the specific truth to thwart the sin nature.

- **A.** "The": the article.
 - a) Points out an object—specificity.
 - b) Draws attention to an object.
 - c) Individualizes—this one not that one.
 - d) Sometimes refers to something previously mentioned.
 - e) English examples.
 - f) New Testament examples (Jn. 1:1; 1 Cor. 12:12).
- **B.** "The Truth" is New Testament doctrine explaining how the Christian overcomes the sin nature.
 - a) Sets one free from the sin nature (Jn. 8:32-34).
 - b) Not in Old Testament (Jn. 1:17).
 - c) Future to Jesus' earthly ministry, not in the Old Testament (Jn. 8:32-34 *cf.* Rom. 6:12, 14, 17).
 - d) Part of the Gospel for maturity (Gal. 2:5, cf. 1:6, 9-10).
 - e) In opposition to a quality of sin (1 Jn. 1:8).
 - f) Precedes fulfilling the New Commandment (1 Jn. 2:4).
 - g) Basis for ordering one's lifestyle (3 Jn. 3-4, 8).
 - h) Faulty doctrine can subterfuge "The Truth" and is a part of "The Faith" (2 Tim. 2:15-18).
 - i) A Christian can gain a full experiential knowledge of "The Truth" (Heb. 10:26).
