Romans 6:1-13

- I.** Review of the Context.
 1. Romans 6:1-13 is a “paragraph” which describes the sin nature as potentially dominating the Christian (*cf.* Tit. 2:12).
 2. This passage describes how at salvation each Christian was counted by the Father to be immersed into Christ Jesus’ process of death, co-buried, and like Christ raised by the Father (Rom. 6:3-4).
 3. The objective of this passage is for Christians to defeat the sin nature in order to live righteously (vv. 4, 13).
- II.** Review of Romans 6:11.
 1. “Likewise reckon . . . yourselves . . .” means like the Father, we are to count ourselves that which does not exist as though it does (Rom. 4:17).
 2. “Dead” here means in the state of death—separated.
 - 1) Death of the body is when it is separated from the immaterial parts (Jam. 2:26; Acts 2:27; *cf.* 1 Thes. 5:23).
 - 2) Christ went through the process of death (vv. 3, 4, 5, 9) and was put to death as a once and for all sacrifice (v. 2, 7, 8, 10). This is called the finished work of Christ. It does not have to be redone.
 - 3) The Father counts in Christ our sin nature nailed to the cross along with its lusts (Gal. 5:24).
- III.** In Christ the Christian is in the state of death to the sin nature.
 1. When we count like the Father the finished work of Christ, we are separating ourselves from the sin nature—death.
 2. Living in the present spiritually is based on a future with Him (vv. 4, 5, 8, 11, 13).
 3. To count yourself in Christ in the present is based on faith in your future resurrection; the converse is true.
- IV.** In Christ the Christian is to count himself alive to the Father “on one hand dead . . . and on the other hand alive” (v. 11).
 1. This means the Christian is to focus on what would please the Father—righteous thoughts (Phil. 2:13).
 2. When Christian counts himself separated from the sin nature this involves rendering some bodily appetites inoperable (Rom. 6:6, 12-13; *cf.* Gal. 5:19-21).
 3. All three Persons of the Godhead are involved.
