The Fruit from the Holy Spirit

- **I.** The fruit is from the Holy Spirit because it is given to the believer as a divine enabling (Gal. 5:22-23).
 - 1. It is to be used by the believer to product his fruit: human responsibility to the divine enabling.
 - 2. All nine facets of the fruit are a manner of viewing circumstances, the ability to discern meaningful relationships, the reasoning that precedes action.
- **II.** The facet of love (Gal. 5:22).
 - 1. Jesus changed the definition of love when referring to humans—ἀγάπη agape {ag-ah'-pay}.
 - 2. "As I loved you", now a divine quality of love (Jn. 13:34).
 - 3. No longer human generated (*cf.* Mt. 22:36-40; Mk. 12:28-30; Lu. 10:25-28).
 - 4. The changes in love:
 - 1) Was human effort; now a divine enabling.
 - 2) Was self-centered; now is other centered.
 - 3) Was measured by a human standard; now measured by a divine standard.
 - 4) Was directed at a human race—the Jews (neighbor Lev. 19:18; Duet. 23:1-7; Mt. 5:43); now directed at a race ("one another", is the church 1 Pet. 2:9; Eph. 4:25).
- III. Jesus' example, or illustration of other centered love (Jn. 13:4-18).
 - 1. It was a highly symbolic washing (vv. 7, 10, 14. 15).
 - 2. Changes terms for 'wash'.
 - 1) Vv. 5, 8, 10, 12, 14 is a partial washing, pouring water from one vessel to another.
 - 2) V. 10 is a complete body washing, bathe.
 - 3. The washing of feet is a symbolic demonstration of ministering to others regardless of position, meeting others' needs, other centered love referred to in verse 34.
 - 4. Note that Judas is excluded from the application of this love; it is for believers only (vv. 10-11, 18).
