## **New Testament Prayer**

Prayer changes the believer

- **I.** Review of different types of prayer (*cf.* Phil. 1:9).
  - 1. Adoration, worship, intercession, supplication, vow, confession, and thanksgiving.
  - 2. The types of communication are not mutually exclusive.
  - 3. Not all types of prayer require an answer.
  - 4. Most of our communication should be thanksgiving and worship.
  - 5. All communication is to the Father, through the Son, and by the Holy Spirit (Heb. 4:14-16).
- **II.** More on thanksgiving.
  - 1. Will be part of God's plan in the ages to come (Rev. 7:12).
  - 2. It is a result of Spirit filling (Eph. 5:20).
- **III.** Paul's special, personal relationship to Christ (1 Cor. 15:5 *cf.* vv. 7-9; Eph. 4:10-11).
  - 1. Paul 'saw' Christ on the Damascus Road (Acts 9:3; 22:8-10; 26:14-16). Note: "appearance" is used twice in Acts 26:16 in two different tenses, one punctiliar past, and the other future in a linear sense. The term has the idea of 'being seen'.
  - 2. Paul spent three years in Arabia after the 'Road' before going to Damascus (Gal. 1:17-18, 12; Acts 9:19).
  - 3. Paul met with Christ repeatedly and received New Testament revelation directly from Him (e.g., Gal. 1:12; 1 Cor. 11:23).
  - 4. Paul asked Christ personally three times, during these appearances, to remove his pain, *i.e.*, three different appearances (2 Cor. 12:4-9).
  - 5. Paul personally thanked Christ for the ministry entrusted to specially to him as under-rower (1 Tim. 1:12; Rom. 16:25).
