## Commandment or Commandments?

- **I.** The New Commandment (Jn. 13:34).
  - 1. Is a new quality of love; the new standard is Jesus.
  - 2. Love is redefined—new concept.
  - 3. Love is now a divine enabling (Gal. 5:22).
  - 4. Love is different from 'fondness' (e.g., Jn. 21:15-17).
  - 5. The New Commandment is not a restatement, or refinement of the 10 Commandments.
- **II.** Commandment or commandments (Jn. 13:34 cf. 15:10).
  - 1. The Father gave Jesus the New Commandment (Jn. 13:34; 15:10, 12, 14, 17; 1 Jn. 3:22-23).
  - 2. Jesus then explained how to practice the New Commandment with commandments (1 Jn. 3:24).

## **III.** Guarding the Commandments:

- 1. Is loving Christ (Jn. 14:15).
- 2. Is loving Christ and is being loved by both the Father and the Son (Jn. 14:21).
- 3. Christ will then be revealed to that one (Jn. 14:21).
- 4. Both the Father and the Son will make him a place to stay (Jn. 14:23).
- 5. Is being 'at ease' in the Father's love (Jn. 15:10).
- 6. Brings practical knowledge of initial salvation (1 Jn. 2:3-4).
- 7. Is maturing in using love and brings practical knowledge of one's position in Christ (1 Jn. 2:5).
- 8. Is a prerequisite to asking-prayer being answered (1 Jn. 3:22).
- 9. The Christian experientially knows that he is 'at ease' in Him and He is 'at ease' in the Christian (1 Jn. 3:24).
- 10. When, by design, we do the commandments, we are experientially knowing we are loving the Father (1 Jn. 5:2-3).
- 11. We are to 'order our lifestyle' according to His commandments and in doing so this fulfills the New Commandment (2 Jn. 6).
