The Mysteries from Paul

The Mystery of The Christ as related to the Father **I.** The Mystery of 'The Christ' as a new creation.

- The Christ' is the Body and the Head—a relationship that is the result of Spirit baptism (1 Cor. 12:12; Eph. 1:22-23; 4:15; 5:23; Col. 1:18; 2:19).
- 2. 'The Christ' was not a mystery (1 Cor. 1:13 cf. Eph. 3:3-4).
- 3. The interdependent relationship is the mystery.
- 4. The New Man:
 - 1) Christ creating the New Man in Himself (Eph. 2:15).
 - 2) A new creation comprised of both Jew and Gentile (2 Cor. 5:17).
- 5. <u>The New Man</u> emphasizes:
 - 1) New creation (2 Cor. 5:17).
 - 2) No racial distinctions (Eph. 2:15-16).
 - 3) Renewal of mind (Col. 3:10).
 - 4) Complete opposite of the Old Man (Col. 3:9-10).
- 6. <u>The Body of Christ</u> emphasizes the interdependence of the members under the Head (1 Cor. 12:27; Eph. 4:240.
- 7. <u>The Christ</u>' emphasizes the Body and the Head in a symbiotic relationship (1 Cor. 12:21; Eph. 4:15).
- **II.** The Mystery regarding 'The Christ' as related to the Father (Col. 2:2-3).
 - 1. Many textual problems in verse two because they misunderstood the mystery by mistaking 'The Christ' as referring to the Person of Christ.
 - 2. The mystery is the relationship of God the Father to "The Christ'.
 - 3. God the Father's relationship to 'The Christ':
 - 1) Those that make up "The Christ' were raised and seated together in the heavenlies in Christ (Eph. 2:6).
 - 2) Our spiritual lives are hidden in 'The Christ' in the Father (Col. 3:3; 2:3; 1 Jn. 5:11).
 - 4. The Church is <u>in</u> the Father (1 Thes. 1:1; 2 Thes. 1:1).
 - 5. The Church has a relationship to the Father comparable to the Son's relationship to the Father (Jn. 17:21-22).
 - 6. Eternal Life involves an intimate, active relationship with the Father as well as the Son.
