## The Fruit from the Spirit

Meekness (Gal. 5:23)

- **I.** What is 'meekness'?
  - 1. The secular meaning: humble, docile, overly submissive, compliant, spiritless, mild.
  - 2. Meekness in Scripture: an objectivity of mind that is not swayed by circumstance or emotions.
- II. Two examples of meekness.
  - 1. Moses was chosen by God to lead the Nation Israel out of Egypt to the Promised Land.
    - 1) Twice when the Nation failed God offered Moses a replacement nation.
      - i. At the golden calf (Ex. 32:1-10).
      - ii. At the news of the giants (Nu. 14:1-3, 11-12).
    - iii. Both times Moses stayed focused on his role.
    - 2) When Aaron and Miriam try to usurp Moses' leadership, he showed meekness in resisting them (Nu. 12:1-8).
  - 2. Jesus (Mt. 11:29).
    - 1) Drove the money changers out of the Temple twice (Jn. 2:13-15; Mk. 11:15-16; Lu. 19:45-46).
    - 2) Ridiculed the Pharisees (Mt. 23:15, 17, 19, 27, 33).
    - 3) Told the apostles to buy swords for personal defense (Lu. 22:3p5-38).
- **III.** Meekness as part of the Fruit from the Spirit.
  - 1. The spirit of meekness (1 Cor. 4:21; Gal. 6:1).
  - 2. The boldness of meekness (2 Cor. 10:1).
  - 3. Meekness in spiritual child-training (2 Tim. 2:25).
  - 4. Meekness seen by the unsaved (Tit. 3:2; 1 Pet. 3:15).
  - 5. Meekness fulfilling the New Commandment (Eph. 4:2).
- IV. Meekness in the Beatitudes (Ps. 37:11; Mt. 5:5).
