The Mystery of Israel's Hardness/blindness

Romans 11:6-25

- **I.** The majority of Israel has a hardened heart (Rom. 11:5-8).
 - 1. Israel is cast off (Rom. 11:15).
 - 2. The Gentiles are reconciled.
- **II.** The olive tree is the place of God's dealing, blessing and not salvation (Rom. 11:17 cf. Acts 15:14).
 - 1. The natural branches, Israel has been broken out of the tree (Rom. 11:17, 19. 20, 21, 22).
 - 2. The wild branches were grafted in the tree (Rom. 11:17).
 - 3. They were grafted in by grace (Rom. 11:6, 20, 21).
- **III.** The three stages pictured in the tree of Romans 11.
 - 1. Stage #1, The Old Testament Nation of Israel (v. 16).
 - 2. Stage #2, the transition from the Old Testament to the New Testament, (v. 17).
 - 3. Stage #3, After the Rapture, Israel will be grafted back into the tree—God will be dealing with them as a Nation again during the Tribulation (vv. 23-24).
- **IV.** The Mystery and its ramifications (Rom. 11:25).
 - 1. The Jews were cast off because of unbelief.
 - 2. The Gentiles were grafted in by grace (vv. 6, 18, 22).
 - 3. After the set number of Gentiles are saved, God will cast off the Gentiles and begin dealing with Israel as a Nation again during the Tribulation.
 - 4. The majority of Gentiles will not be saved
 - 5. This dispensation will not end in a great revival.
 - 6. This dispensation will end due to the failure of the Church.
