## The Mysteries regarding the Church at Smyrna

- I. Smyrna means "crushed myrrh" (Rev. 2:8-11).
  - 1. A rich port city 35 miles north of Ephesus.
  - 2. Myrrh was a valuable commodity (cf. Mt. 2:9-11).
    - 1) Used medically for wounds.
    - 2) Used in embalming.
    - 3) When myrrh is crushed the full fragrance is brought out.
  - 3. Christ begins by addressing the pastor and then includes others in the church; He switches from  $2^{nd}$  person singular to  $2^{nd}$  person plural (v. 10).
  - 4. There is no reprimand addressed to this church.
  - 5. The only negative statement is to those of "the synagogue of Satan" who are an outside group described in the 3<sup>rd</sup> person: "them" and "they".
  - 6. Therefore, the description of the Image must be interpreted as supportive rather than correctional as is the case with most of the churches.
- **II.** The Image assures those at Smyrna that Christ is aware and understands their physical sufferings.
  - 1. "The first and the last" (v. 8).
    - 1) He is the First in the spiritual building of the Church: the foundation (1 Cor. 3:11; Eph. 2:20).
    - 2) He is the Last in the spiritual building of the Church: the Keystone (1 Pet. 2:6).
    - 3) Christ is *all things in all ways* to the Church (Eph. 1:22-23).
  - 2. "The One who became in the state of death and the One who became alive."
    - 1) Christ had victory over death (Rev. 1:18).
    - 2) Christ holds the keys to the death process (cf. Heb. 2:14).
      - i. He is the first-fruit of our type of resurrection.
      - ii. Death now has no sting (1 Cor. 15:54-57).
    - 3) He has the keys to Hades.
      - i. The 'door' will remain shut to the church (Mt. 16:16).
      - ii. The church will go to another place (Jn. 14:2-3).
      - iii. Obviously, those in this church will face physical death for their faith and must remember Who is in control of their physical life.
