Creation

- **I.** Review of Genesis 1:1
 - 1. "<u>a</u>" beginning, no article since there was activity prior to the creation of the material universe.
 - 2. The Three Persons considered various plans: council.
 - 3. The Three agreed upon the Father's plan: counsel, or decree (Eph. 1:3-4).
 - 4. Spirit beings were already created when the universe came into existence (Job 38:1-7): cherubim, seraphim, angels.
 - 5. "beginning" there are other words for beginning.
 - 1) 'first' as in a series of events (Job 42:12).
 - 2) The idea is of a 'former state.'
 - 6. "**created**" is to bring to be, out of nothing (Jn. 1:3; Heb. 11:3).
 - 7. "created" also implies completion/perfection (Duet. 32:4; 1 Cor. 14:33; Is. 45:18; Ps. 104:30).
 - 8. Interpretive summary of Genesis 1:1

In a former state God created perfectly, out of nothing, the heavens and the earth.

- **II.** By Genesis 1:2 the conditions on the earth have changed.
 - 1. The order of the words in the verse is irregular.
 - 2. "And" would be better translated "but".
 - 3. Verse two implies judgment grammatically.
 - 4. Since the only created persons were spirit beings, what happened to cause the judgment in verse two?
- **III.** The universe was ruled from earth before Genesis 1:2 (Ez. 28:14-19).
 - 1. The concept of a 'prop' when referring to Satan.
 - 1) The power behind human activity (Rev. 2:13).
 - 2) Used a snake (Gen. 3:4; 2 Cor. 11:3, 14; Rev. 12:9, 14-15; 20:2).
 - 3) Used Peter (Mt. 16:22-23).
 - 2. Key terms proving the use of a 'prop' in Ez. 28):
 - 1) Anointed Cherub (v. 14).
 - 2) Created (v. 15).
 - 3) Mountain of God (vv. 14, 16 cf. Is. 2:2; Dan. 2:34-35; 44-45).
 - 4) Eden the Garden of God (v. 13 cf. Gen. 2:8).
