## The Mysteries regarding the Church at Smyrna III

I. To the church at Smyrna- 'crushed myrrh' (Rev. 2:8-11).

1. The pastor is encouraged:
1) To remember the difference between physical and spiritual riches (v. 9).
2) To resist the misuse of the Old Testament when physical blessings are conditionally promised, particularly during physical suffering (v. 9).
3) This necessitates understanding New Testament trials.
2. The church is told they will suffer physically (v. 10).
1) Satan will have some of them put in prison: government.
2) They will be tempted during a set time of persecution.
3) They will face physical death.
4) They are encouraged to be faithful as far as the point of the death process (v. 11).
5) Those who remain faithful will be rewarded the Crown of the Life (v. 10).
i. Resisting temptation even with looming death.
ii. Resist the temptation specific to the individual (Jam. 1:12)
a) "The crown of the life" in both verses.
b) Placing one's spiritual life above one's physical life.
iii. "The life" cannot be eternal life, since the Christian already has this life.
iv. "The life" must be living out eternal life through exercising resurrection life: no fear of physical death (Rom. 6:11). Note: assurance of the Image.
v. The Crown of Life is for Christians that overcome s specific temptation in their life: 'the pebble in the shoe you cannot get rid of'.
II. The promise to the overcomer: no harm from the second death.
1. Promise given to Christians (1 Jn. 5:5).
2. Promise to spiritual Christians: "has an ear" (cf. 1 Cor. 3:1-3).
3. No harm from the second death process.
4. Physical death is separation (Jam. 2:26 cf. 1 Tim. 5:6; Rom. 6:23).
1) The spirit leaves the body (Jam. 2:26).
5. The soul leaves the body (Acts 5:5, 10; Acts 2:27cf. Lu. 23:43; 1 Ki. 17:21-22). Spiritual death, the second death is eternal separation from God (Rev. 20:11-15 cf. Mt. 25:41, 46).
