Spirit Filling

- **I.** The exhortation to be filled by the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18).
 - 1. "Filled" is an imperative, very strong suggestion.
 - 2. "Filled" is passive, not self-generated.
- II. How are you filled by the Holy Spirit?
 - 1. A gift from God, not out of yourself (Eph. 2:8).
 - 2. Not earned, no "steps"! A Christian in activity is either spiritual or carnal (Rom. 6:16).
 - 3. The 'car' analogy.
 - 1) Reverse—carnal, emanating things of the flesh.
 - 2) Neutral—ceremonially clean (1 Jn. 1:9).
 - 3) Foreword drive—spiritual, emanating things from the Holy Spirit.
- III. What is Spirit filling?
 - 1. Not control, either mentally or physically.
 - 2. The Holy Spirit makes up what is lacking in the Christian's thinking, this involves filling from the Spirit (Rom. 15:13).
 - 3. A mental activity (Rom. 8:5-6).
- IV. The facets of the Fruit from the Spirit that comfort (Gal. 5:22-23).
 - 1. **Joy**—the mental willingness to accept and appreciate any circumstance, without resentment or frustration.
 - 2. **Peace**—an unruffled mind, an inner overriding tranquility of rationale, not an emotion.
 - 1) Peace in the area of thought (Rom. 8:6).
 - 2) A peace not like the world's (Jn. 14:37; 1 Thes. 5:3).
 - 3) Peace is not disorder, near anarchy (1 Cor. 14:33).
 - 4) Not a 'push over' (Rom. 16:20).
 - 5) Peace guards the heart—emotions (Phil. 4:7; Col. 3:15).
 - 6) Peace in the realm of the Kingdom of God (Rom. 14:17; 1 Thes. 2:12).
 - 7) Peace binds Christians in unanimity (Eph. 4:3).
 - 8) The Gospel of peace (Eph. 6:15; Rom. 5:1; Eph. 2:14-15).
 - **V.** Peace from God contrasted with the peace with God (Eph. 6:15; Rom. 5:1; Eph. 2:14-15).
