

**The Ten Commands**

<b>1</b>	Have no other gods alongside of Jehovah	Death	Duet. 17:2-7	Col. 3:5

- Commandments numbers 6-10 were for Jew-to-Jew behavior: neighbor (Ex. 22:25-26).
- In addition to the Ten Commandments, there were 500+ statutes: dietary, ceremonial etc.
- The Law consisted in three parts: the Ten Commandments, the statutes, and the judgments (Duet. 5:23; 7:11).
- All three parts of the Law were to be observed, no picking and choosing (Duet. 27:25; Gal. 3:10; 5:3).
